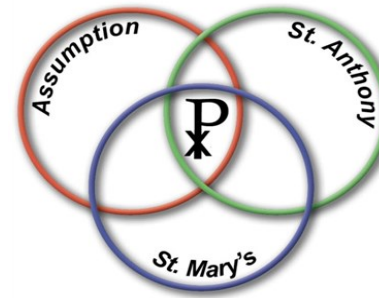

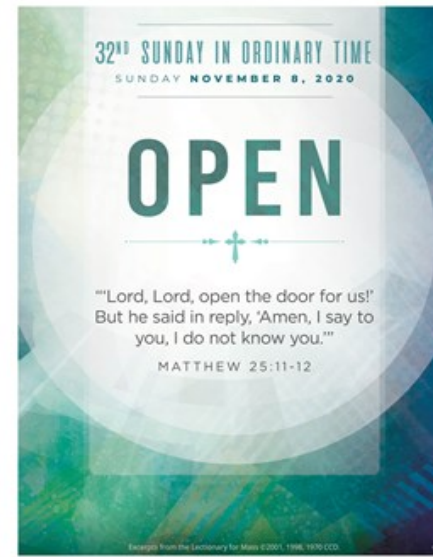

**Father's Corner...** Praying for the Dead: During the month of November we pray especially for those who have died. In the Book of Maccabees, written around 150 BC, Judas Maccabees prayed for those who had died in battle, that the sinful deeds they had done, wearing pagan gods' medals, would be blotted out, 2 Macc 12: 38-45. He took up a collection that he sent to Jerusalem for sacrifices to be made for those who had died. St. Paul prayed for his deceased friend Onesiphorus, 2 Tim 1:15-18.

We pray for those who have died to help them. If someone is in Purgatory, our prayers for them will help them to open their hearts to God's mercy, to do penance and to help them be able to enter into Heaven.

If someone is in Heaven already and we pray for them, then our prayers will allow them to be even more open to God's grace, or God could use our prayers to help them while they were still here on earth. Remember that God is not bound by linear time.

If someone is in Hell and we pray for them, then our prayers will either directly lighten their pain and punishment and/or God can use our prayers to help them not to commit more mortal sins while they were alive on earth and so not to suffer even worse punishment in Hell.

Lastly, praying for the dead helps us who are left behind on this earth to be open to God's healing of the pain we experience when someone we love passes over into the afterlife.

Remember that we can't only pray for those who have died, but we can also pray to them. Love and caring do not end because these things come from our souls and our souls continue in the afterlife. So just as we can ask a person here on earth to pray for us, so we can ask those who have passed on to pray for us as well. They do not have to be Canonized Saints for us to pray to them and to ask them to pray for and with us. Any of the people you loved while they were on earth will be glad and joyful to be asked to pray for you and with you now that they are closer to God.

**Pope Francis extends indulgences** throughout November 2020. The faithful may gain a plenary (whole) indulgence for the Souls in purgatory by a "Visit to a Church" on All Souls Day. On visiting the Church it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited" (N.15). By special mandate by Pope Francis this has been extended to any day during the month of November.

A Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful **who visit a cemetery...** has been extended to all days during the month of November 2020, which is beyond the normal time frame (days 1 -8); can also be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery even if only mentally (mentally for anyone who is homebound); and who devoutly prays for the faithful departed and completes the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence which are Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions, within 7 days of visiting the cemetery.

Father Paul is available for Confession anytime by appointment, on Saturdays from 2:30PM to 4PM at St. Mary's Church.
