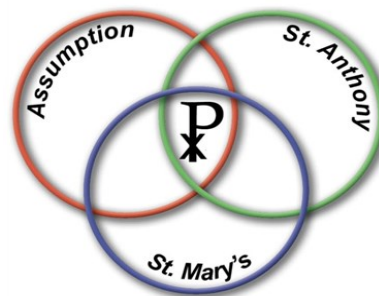

Father's Corner... Juan Diego was a 57-year-old widower, his wife died two year before, living with his uncle in a village near Mexico City. He was a peasant farmer and laborer, who while born under Aztec rule had converted to Catholicism. On December 9th, 1531, he was on his way to attend Mass, when the morning quiet is broken by a strange music that he will later describe as the beautiful sound of birds. Diverting his path to investigate the sound, Juan Diego comes face to face with a radiant apparition of the Virgin Mary on Tepeyac Hill, the site of a former Aztec Temple. Juan Diego is dazzled by the incredible beauty and miraculous nature of Our Lady's appearance. She appears as a native princess to him, and her words sound more beautiful than the sweetest music ever made.

Our Lady calms the startled traveler and assures him of who she is. She instructs Juan Diego to visit his bishop and ask that a temple be built on the site of her appearance, so that she will have a place to hear petitions and to heal the suffering of the Mexican people. "Now go and put forth your best effort," Our Lady instructs. Visibly shaken, Juan Diego approaches the Bishop who is initially very skeptical of his account. The Bishop patiently listens to Juan Diego's accounts and dismisses him. The humble farmer had failed.

On December 10th, he returns to Tepeyac Hill where he hopes for some confirmation of what he's experienced. Indeed, Our Lady does not disappoint, for she appears again, as radiant as before. Juan Diego tells Our Lady what she already knows that the Bishop did not believe him. She instructs him to return and ask again. The Bishop is beside himself. Why did this peasant insist on telling this story? How could he know if the peasant was lying or perhaps insane? At their second meeting, the Bishop asks for a sign. Juan Diego makes a promise he won't keep, saying he will return the very next morning with a sign from Our Lady. But that evening, Juan Diego returns home to find his uncle, Juan Bernadino, who is 68 years old, and suddenly, terribly ill. The illness is known to the people there and it brings a burning fever so hot, and is almost always fatal. Juan Diego cannot leave his uncle's bedside to keep his pledge to the Bishop. He spends two days with his uncle, trying to save him. When it becomes apparent his uncle is about to die, he leaves to find a priest who can give him Last Rites. *To be continued next week.*

December 12 & 13: Examination of Conscience instead of a homily and General Absolution will be given at the weekend Masses. Priests are not traveling and gathering for penitential services this Advent.

~*St. Francis Xavier* Saint Francis Xavier (+1552) was a great Spanish Jesuit missionary to Asia. We celebrated the Memorial of Saint Francis Xavier on December 3rd.



St. Anne, the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary, honor to her can be traced almost to the very beginning of Christianity. Extra-biblical sources give us Anne's name and details about her union to Joachim, Mary's father. Her feast was celebrated in the East as early as the 4th century. In the Middle Ages, crusaders brought the devotion to Anne to Europe, where it spread rapidly. Anne became a subject of artists, who frequently portrayed her teaching young Mary. In keeping with her role as mother, Anne became intercessor for women in childbirth and for farmers in planting season. Veneration to Saint Anne was brought to North America with the first European colonists. In Canada, the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre' in Quebec has had a reputation as a place of healing since March 13, 1658, the day construction was begun. One of those present that day, Louis Guimont, experienced a miraculous healing of what may have been severe kidney disease after he placed three stones in the foundation of the chapel. From that time the humble church, now a towering neo-Roman basilica, has seen hundreds of miraculous cures of the sick and disabled person. (*Magnificat Dec 2020*)
