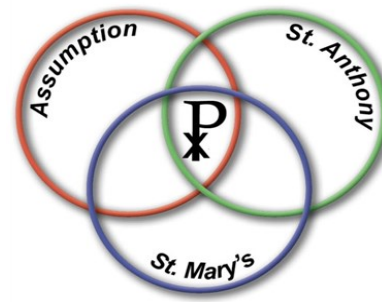

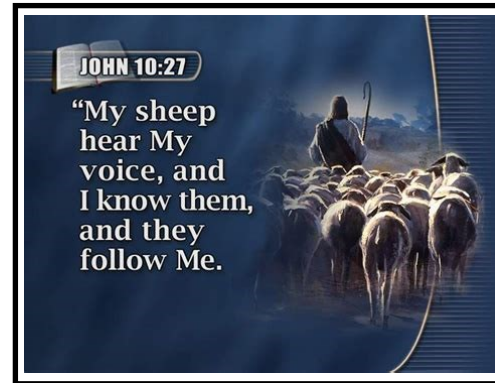

Father's Corner: St. Mary's is hosting a "Life Planning Seminar" being put on by our Diocese and the Idaho Catholic Foundation on May 19, 2022. This will address end of life issues such as life-support, cremation, legal issues, and estate planning.

These are issues that we all should address and plan for. These issues are important not just because of the legal and financial issues, but for the moral and emotion concerns. Planning for your death and what happens then is an act of Love for your family. Because, if you do not plan in advance this can leave your family a tremendous heart ache and tear your family apart. For example, what if you are incapacitated and dying. Do they ask that you be placed on full life support for months or even years as you lay there in a comatose state? When do they turn off the life support? Do they never use any? How do your children make those decisions and how much are they going to fight and argue over these issues if you have never stated your wishes and desires? \

What happens to your estate after you are gone? I have seen families destroyed arguing over their parents' estate. Brothers and sisters, who have not talked for 40 to 50 years because of bad feelings over who got what after their parents had died.

I am not saying that this will happen to your family but it might. When a loved one dies everyone is under a lot of stress, emotions are high and there is a lot of stress in dealing with the pain of the death. Because of the strong emotions it is easy for people to get hurt and those hurts can cut very deep and take a long time to heal or even to never heal.

If we can address some of these issues before, then it makes the burden much easier on those we love, who otherwise have to make all these decisions when their thinking has been clouded by pain and loss.

Therefore, I want to encourage you to attend this upcoming "Life Planning Seminar" as an act of Love and caring for your family.
