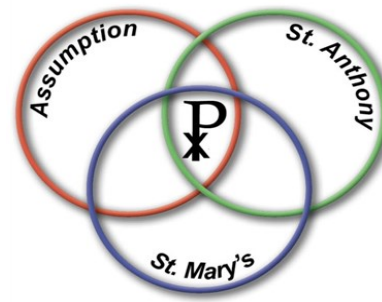

**Father's Corner:** Patron Saint: Next Sunday, we will be celebrating St. Mary's Parish Patron Feast Day. What is a patron Saint you may ask? A patron Saint is the protecting or guiding saint of a person or place.

Few practices of the Catholic Church are as misunderstood by non-Catholics as praying to Saints. From the earliest days of the Church, people and groups have chosen Saints to intercede for them with God. Of course, we always pray to God, but it is asking a friend to pray with us for our need, except this friend is already in Heaven. That is the Communion of Saints in actual practice.

Scripture urges us to pray for one another. As Christians, we believe that those who have died here on earth, still live in Heaven and so are capable and willing to pray for us as we pray for others still on earth.

The practice of having Patron Saints of Churches goes back to the first Catholic Churches in the Roman Empire which were usually built over the graves of Martyrs. The Church took on the names of the Saints buried there and those Martyrs were expected to pray for anyone worshipping there.

Soon other Churches were named after other Saints who were not necessarily Martyrs. Most Altars in Catholic Churches have a relic of a Saint inside it. And when a Church is dedicated a name of a Saint is given to the Church building to be the patron of all who worship there. The Virgin Mary is the Patron of St. Mary's and Assumption, St. Anthony is the Patron of St. Anthony Church and the relic of the Passion of Christ, the Holy Cross is the patron of Holy Cross Church.
