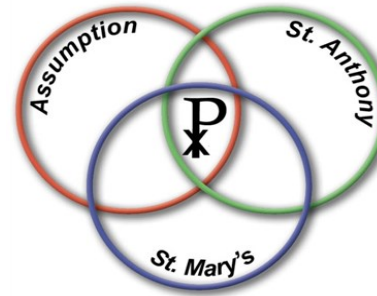

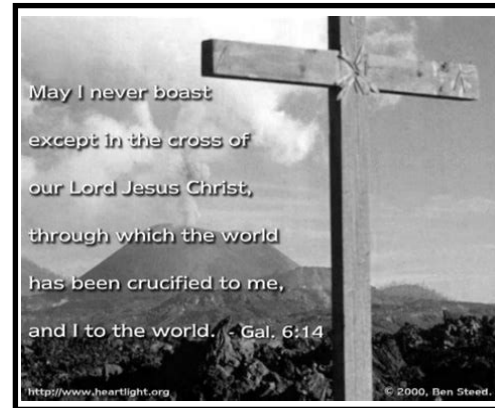

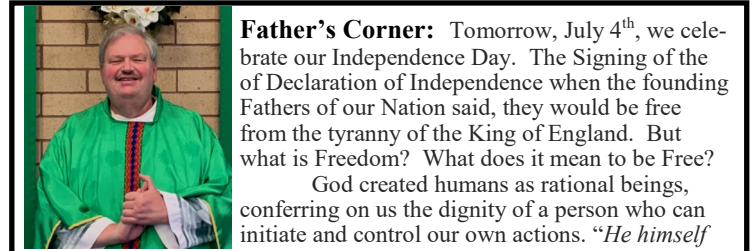
We are many parts, we are all one body.

Father's Corner: Tomorrow, July 4th, we celebrate our Independence Day. The Signing of the Declaration of Independence when the founding Fathers of our Nation said, they would be free from the tyranny of the King of England. But what is Freedom? What does it mean to be Free?

God created humans as rational beings, conferring on us the dignity of a person who can initiate and control our own actions. *"He himself made man in the beginning and then left him free to make his own decisions. If you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power"* (Sir 15:14-15).

Freedom is the power, rooted in reason and will, to act or not to act and so to perform deliberate actions on one's own responsibility. Human freedom is a force for growth and maturity, in truth and goodness and it attains its perfections when directed towards God. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is Good and Just. To choose to do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to *"slavery to sin"* (Rom 6:17). This freedom makes us responsible for our acts. (CCC1734).

By His glorious Cross, Christ has redeemed us from the sin that held us in bondage. In Him we have communion with the truth that makes us free. As Jesus said, *"if you make my word your home you will indeed be my disciples, you will learn the truth and the truth shall make you free"* (Jn 8:31-32). As disciple, we are given the Holy Spirit who gives us the *"freedom and glory of being Children of God"*. (Rom 8:21).

Freedom does not imply or mean the right to say or do whatever someone may want. Freedom means following the moral law – what is right and just. Freedom must be exercised with and guided by and for CHARITY -Love of God and Neighbor.

The 4th of July, Independence Day, should not just be a celebration of our Country's Birth. It should be a celebration of our freedom from Sin so we can Love God, love our Neighbors throughout the world, and our Freedom to follow Christ and to lead all people into Heaven. *"When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery"* (Gal 5: 1-2)
