





Father's Corner: Grandparents:

Tuesday, July 26th, is the Feast Day of Sts. Joachim & Anne, the parents of the Virgin Mary and Grandparents of Jesus; therefore, I have chosen to write about Grandparents. There is no mention of the parents of the Virgin Mary in the

Bible. What we know of them comes from Catholic legend and the apocryphal gospel of James. This writing says that Mary was promised to Joachim and Anne by an angel. While scholars can debate about these two saints, I think that we can agree that they were good, faithful parents of the Virgin Mary and raised her with love and devotion to God.

We do not know if Jesus knew them. But their influence impacted and guided him either directly or through Mary.

This Feast Day is a call to us to reflect on our Grandparents and families. I knew all four of my Grandparents and one of my Great Grandmothers. Many raised here on the Prairie know, or knew their Grandparents. Have you ever sat down with them and learned their history? Have you recorded any of their stories about their parents or Grandparents? Many years ago, when I was in High School, I sat with my Grandfather and recorded him talking about his life and stories he learned from his parents in Holland. Another of my family legends is that some of my Mother's ancestors escaped religious persecution in a hot air balloon which crash landed in Germany in the I700's and that is how the family moved to here from Germany.

What are your family stories? Those of you who are Grand-parents, what examples of living our faith are you passing on to your grandchildren? Are you teaching them any private or popular devotions? Are you telling them stories not only of your life but of your grandparents? Have you taken time to write or record any of the stories of your ancestors so that future generations may know them? So often by the time children or grandchildren become interested in family history, those who knew the history have passed on and the knowledge is lost.
