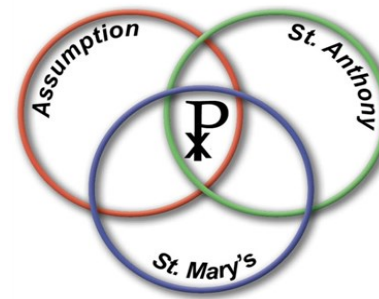

Father's Corner:
The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church. Part 4.
 Holy Communion. The Sacrament of the Eucharist is called Holy Communion because when we receive the Eucharist we come into intimate communion with the

sacrifice of Christ; and therefore, are in intimate communion with Christ and through Him with one another. The Eucharist, in Holy Communion, is the efficacious sign and the cause of our communion in the divine life and in the unity of the People of God that makes the Church and keeps it in being. That is why we say "the Eucharist makes the Church" (26). At every Mass we are gathered together, in communion, with all those present and with all the holy Saints who have gone before us. Our obligation to attend Mass each Sunday and Holy Day is both a vital expression of our unity as members of the Body of Christ and a manifestation that we are dependent upon God and His grace. Our participation in worshipping at Mass is an Act of Love.

Having received the Eucharist and been filled with the grace of faith, hope, and charity, we are called to respond to this gift. Our first action is giving thanks. The very word, "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving." The Second Vatican Council taught that we are called to have full active and conscious participation in the Mass. We do this by engaging our minds and hearts and bodies in the liturgy. Listening to the words spoken in the prayers, Scriptures, and homilies; by joining in the singing and the responses; by engaging our bodies in kneeling, sitting, and standing. By bringing all that we are to the worship of God.
