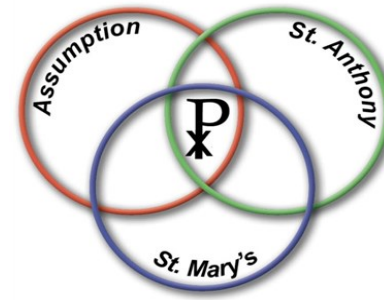

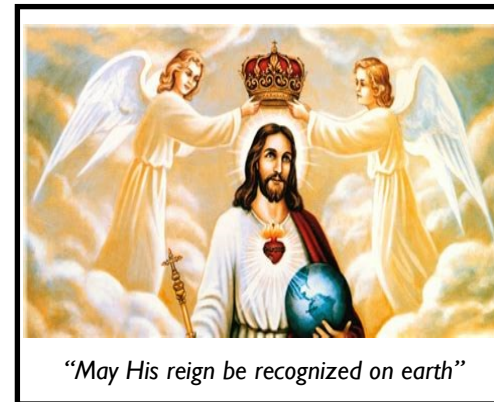

**Father's Corner:  
 Reflections from the Beach - #3**

As I am walking on the beach listening to the waves with the wind blowing on my back, I am reflecting on my faith.

I have faith, I believe in God, I believe in Jesus, and I try to do my best to follow Him. But when was the last time that I really reflected on my faith? When did I last really take time out to think about my relationship with Jesus? How can I pray better? How can I live my faith better? Yes, I go on annual retreats sponsored by the Diocese, but they are more about education than working on my relationship with Christ. It is not just about praying for five minutes or even one hour, but it is about spending a good chunk of time building and growing your relationship with God, with Jesus.

A concrete example of what I mean is: What about your relationship with your spouse? When was the last time you asked, "how is my relationship with my spouse?" Of course, you love our spouse and your children. However, what can you do to improve it? To make your marriage even deeper and greater? When did you and your spouse last go on a Marriage Encounter or a couple's retreat, if ever? Yes, you have been married for 10, 20, 30, or even 40 or 50 years. Of course you say "we love each other" and have a great marriage. Wonderful I am so happy. However, can it be better? Can you improve your communications, can you improve your love? Marriage Encounters, couples retreats, date nights are just some obvious ways to grow your relationship. How are you trying to grow your marriage relationship?

Now, what about your relationship with Jesus? Is it growing? When did you last make a retreat? Not just spend some time up in the mountains but with a retreat leader, or a spiritual director? How do you communicate with Jesus? Do you read the Bible and reflect on God and what God likes?
