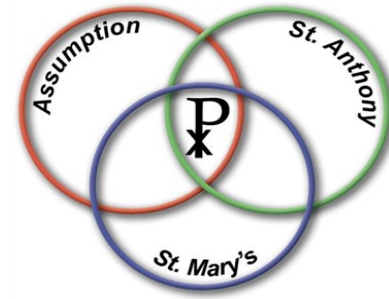

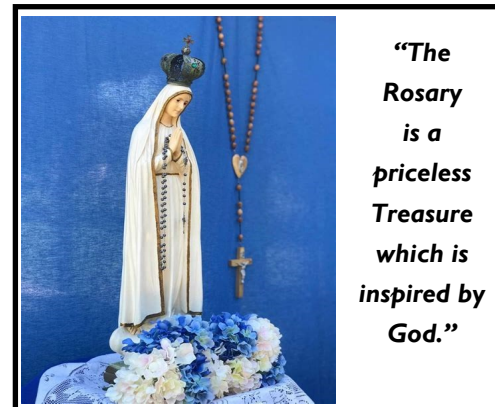

Father's Corner... The Rosary: part 4.

To pray the Rosary:

1. Make the Sign of the Cross
2. Holding the Crucifix, pray the *Apostles' Creed*
3. First bead - Pray the *Our Father*
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads, For the three Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope & Charity.
5. Say the *Glory Be*
6. For each of the five decades announce the *Mystery* (perhaps followed by a brief reading of Scripture) then say the *Our Father*
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade - say a *Hail Mary* while meditating on the *Mystery*. Then say a *Glory Be*. (after finishing each decade some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of Thy mercy").
8. After saying the five decades, say the *Hail Holy Queen* followed by this dialogue and prayer:

- V. Pray for us, O most holy Mother of God
- R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Then all pray together: *Let us pray, O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by His Life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.*

Along the way, they will stop at parishes to pray, process, and gather, unified around the Blessed Sacrament. This unprecedented opportunity allows the faithful in Idaho to join with one of the largest Eucharistic pilgrimages in history, as part of the national Eucharistic Revival sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. On May 27th, Bishop Peter will meet Bishop Cary of the Diocese of Baker on the border between Oregon and Idaho, where they will solemnly transfer the Blessed Sacrament to our diocese.
