





Father's Corner: Mother's Day

Mother's Day is a day honoring motherhood. Celebrations of mothers and motherhood can be traced back to the ancient Greek and Romans, who held festivals in honor of mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele. The earliest precedent for the modern Mother's Day is the early Christian festival known as "Mothering Sunday" in the United Kingdom - a day when worshippers returned

to their main church, or "Mother Church," said the article.

In America, Mother's Day dates to the 19th century. Ann Reeves Jarvis of West Virginia helped to start "Mothers Day Clubs" to teach local women how to properly care for their children. The official Mother's Day was created by Anna Jarvis, the daughter of Ann Reeves Jarvis, in 1908 as a way of honoring the sacrifices mothers make for their children. It became an official U.S. holiday in 1914, when President Woodrow Wilson declared Mother's Day to be a national holiday.

Anna originally conceived of Mother's Day as a day of personal celebration between mothers and families. Her version of the day involved wearing a white carnation as a badge and visiting one's mother or attending church services. But once Mother's Day became a national holiday, it was not long before florists, card companies and other merchants capitalized its popularity.

Question of the Week: Why do we call the Virgin Mary "Our Mother"?

The title "Mother of the Church" was conferred on the Blessed Virgin Mary by Pope Paul VI on November 21, 1964. The title accents Mary's role as mother of all Christians through her role as Mother of the Savior Jesus.

Jesus says, "Remain in me, as I remain in you" Jn 15:4. Jesus is in us and we are in Jesus. As Mary was the mother of Jesus and we are in Jesus, then Mary is our Mother also. This is shown also at the Crucifixion when Jesus looks down to His mother and the disciple John and says, "Woman, behold your son" and then to John, "Behold your mother" Jn 19:26-27. John represents all of us, the Church, taking the Blessed Virgin mary as our Mother.

Story Link: Wow! We had 21 residents at NICI read in April through the Story Link prison ministry. If we had 1 or 2 more volunteers, we could expand to twice a month, but volunteers would only go once per month. Story Link's Mission: Linking children and incarcerated parents with the gift of reading. Residents who qualify are allowed to select a children's book provided by the program and to read the book with a short message of love as volunteers record them on a CD. The book and CD are then mailed to the child's caregiver. This gives families the opportunity to stay linked and gives children the opportunity to hear their parent's voice.

We currently go once a month, 3rd Thursday, 1:00 – 3:30ish pm, depending on number of men signed up to read. This is a super easy program to volunteer with, as the men are so appreciative for this opportunity. They are so thankful and respectful of our volunteering for our time with them.

If you are interested in helping with this ministry or want more information, please contact Raina Frei, 208-507-2005, or rainafrei@gmail.com. If we have enough people, then we can alternate months. You would not be expected to do anything by yourself --we would help any new person become comfortable with how we run the program and we always go in pairs. A Volunteer Training through the Idaho Dept of Corrections (IDOC) is required before you can be an official prison volunteer. A training is set at Grangeville, Wed, July 9, 5-9 pm. Also, training at Lewiston, Thurs, Aug 21, 5-9 pm. (Typically, we're done earlier)
