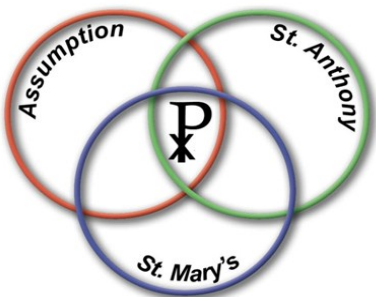

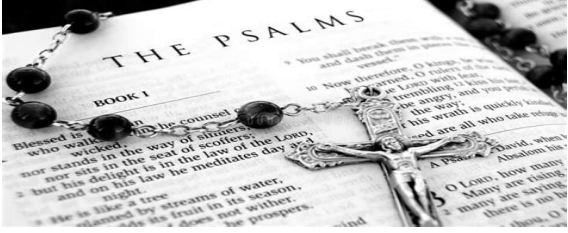

Father's Corner... Since the 'question of the week' has a long answer, I have decided to make it Father's Corner this week.
"Why is Communion under both forms (both species) and why is it optional?"

In the early Church, Communion was received by most everyone under both forms of the Body and Blood of Christ. Gradually this changed so that by the 12th century most of the laity only received the one form - the Body of Christ. The reason for this change was probably due to concerns about spilling the Precious Blood and distributing the chalice to large congregations.

I remember when I was a young child the Blood of Christ was only offered to all the laity two or three times a year, one was on the Feast of Corpus Christi - now the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ; one priest told me one of the days was Holy Thursday. I do not remember if there were any other times. No one that I contacted could remember either. I am not sure if this was Universal for the whole Church or just in our Diocese. If someone remembers please let me know. However, when the Blood of Christ was offered it was only done by intinction, which, by the way, is no longer allowed by the Vatican as drops of the Precious Blood were often being dropped on the floor. Intinction was allowed briefly for everyone after Covid 19.

The Vatican II Council (1962-1965) called for a renewed appreciation of the Eucharist. The reasoning for this is that receiving under both forms would more fully express the Eucharistic meal and the communion of the faithful. Allowing for this to occur, the Council also called for the people of the Baptized to remember to practice more of their 'Priesthood of the Baptized.' Specifically for the Baptized Laity to be Eucharistic Ministers (1971) and to assist in the giving of the Eucharist to members of the Church at Mass, other liturgies, and to the homebound.

In line with this many dioceses have reintroduced the practice of distributing both Forms of the Eucharist. This is not required by the Universal Church but is allowed and is strongly recommended by our Diocese.

The Catholic Church believes and teaches that receiving the Eucharist under either form, Body or Blood, is a complete reception of the Eucharist as Christ is fully present in each of the species.
