

Father's Corner...Proof of God's Existence.

St. Thomas Aquinas listed 5 proofs of God's existence. 1: First Mover - all things are either potentially in motion or actually in motion and nothing can move itself, but it must be put into motion by something else. Therefore, there must be a 'First Mover" who is outside the normal universe This is God.

- 2: Nothing is the efficient cause of itself. Example: if A causes B then if A is absent then there can be no B. There are effects so there must be causes. There must be a first cause for them all. This is God.
- 3: Possibility and Necessity. In nature things are possible to be, and to not to be (contingent beings). And it is impossible for contingent beings to always exist for that which can, not-be at the same time is not. Therefore, at one time there was nothing, but now there is something. Therefore, there must be something that is necessary and always was God.
- 4: Graduation. Graduation can be found in things. Example: some are hotter or colder. There is a most or highest thing that all such items are measured from. There is good, therefore there must be a most good. Something which is to all beings the causes of their being, their goodness. We call this being God.
- 5: Design. Natural bodies act towards ends. Anything that acts toward an end must act out or knowledge or under the direction of something with knowledge. Example: an arrow is directed by the archer. Since many natural beings lack knowledge there must be some intelligent being by whom all natural things are directed to their end. We call this being God.
