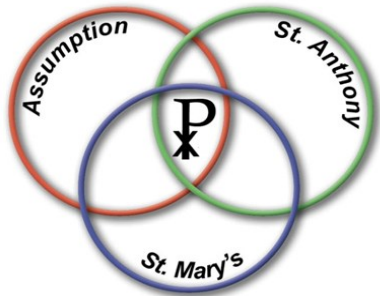

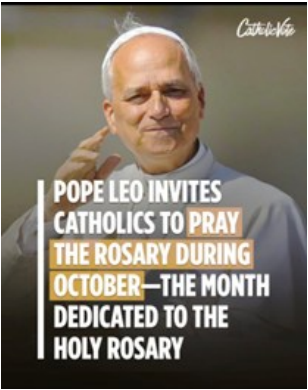

Father's Corner... Sacraments— continued

From the day of Pentecost the Church has celebrated Holy Baptism (Acts 2:38). The Apostles offered Baptism to anyone who believed in Jesus no matter what their previous religion, or their age, race or sex. (Act 2:41; 8:12-13; 10:48; 16:15; 16:31-33).

When we are Baptized we join with Christ's Passion and Death so that we can join with Christ in His resurrection to the newness of life

(Rom 6:3-4; Col 2:12). Over the centuries of the Church's existence the preparation for Baptism, the speed and exactly how the Baptism was done has varied. Some elements have always been present: Proclamation of the Word, an acceptance of the Gospel leading to conversion, a profession of faith and then of course, the actual Baptism with water and the Holy Spirit.

Some of our Protestant cousins object to infant Baptism. To answer some of their objections: 1) When the Apostles baptized whole household any babies in the household would have been Baptized. 2) A baby can not make a profession of faith nor can the baby accept the Gospel leading to conversion - two of the elements above - but their parents and Godparents make this profession and acceptance on their behalf promising to lead the baby on the way of faith. Then this requires a post-baptismal catechumenate - which is why we send our children to Religious Education classes. 3) Some Protestants say they want their child to be old enough to make the decision of their faith themselves. I would respond to that by asking if they waited until their child was a teenager to send them to school? Or to teach them anything about how to live and behave in the world? And of course they do not, so why wait to have them start to follow Christ and to receive His help and Grace? Why would you deny your “child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God?” (CCC1250). 4)A human is born with Original Sin, a loss of the Original Grace that God intended all of us to have. Baptism restores Original Grace.
