



Father's Corner... "Feast of St John Bosco"
St. John Bosco is the patron of apprentices, editors, publishers, schoolchildren, magicians, and juvenile delinquents. He is also the patron of the Catholic School in Cottonwood. He was born August 16, 1815, in Becchi, Italy, and died January 31, 1888, and Canonized April 1, 1934 by Pope Pius XI.

John's father died when John was 2 years old. When he was 9 years old he had his first dream of several that influenced his life. In his dream he encountered a multitude of boys who swore as they played. Among these boys he encountered a great, majestic man and woman. The man told him that in meekness and charity he would "conquer these your friends." Then the lady said, "Be strong, humble and robust. When the time comes you will understand everything." Not long after this John witnessed a troupe of traveling circus performers; he realized that he could use these same tricks to attract others, so he learned how to do them. He began to stage shows for the other kids and at the end he would repeat the homily he had heard at church.

John discerned that he was called to be a priest. His older brother became very hostile insisting that John be "a farmer like us!" At age 12 John left home looking for work as a laborer. In 1835, John entered the seminary and was ordained a priest in 1847. His first assignment was in the city of Turin. While visiting prisons, John noticed that there were many boys between 12 and 18 that were incarcerated and he decided to help other boys not end up in prison. He started going into the streets where he used his talents as a performer, doing tricks to capture attention, then sharing with the children his message for the day. Whenever he was not preaching Father Bosco worked tirelessly seeking work for boys who needed it and searching for lodging for others. His mother began to help him and she became known as "Mamma Margherita." By the 1860's Father Bosco and his mother were responsible for lodging 800 boys.

Father Bosco negotiated new rights for the boys employed as apprentices that forbade abuse, established that they could not be beaten and would be granted off for Feast Days. He encouraged those he thought would be good priests to consider it and helped to prepare them.

In 1859, Father Bosco established the Society of St. Francis de Sales to carry on his charitable work, helping boys with their faith formation and to help them stay out of trouble. At his canonization Father Bosco was given the title of "Father and Teacher of Youth."
