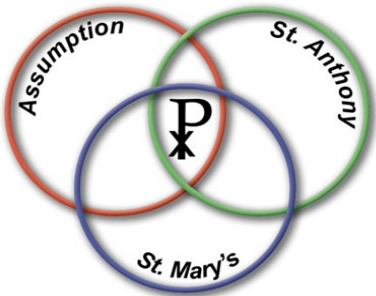

Father's Corner ...
Covenants of the Bible, part 6 of 6

The Davidic Covenant
As King David was Israel's ideal king, Jesus as God is the true King of all.

1.) Dynasty : Jesus was of the house and lineage of David and will have everlasting rule. (Mt 1:1-16; Lk 1:32-33; 2:4-5)

2.) Temple: The Jerusalem Temple housed the presence of God. Jesus bears within Himself

God's glory much more profoundly (Mt 12:6; 1:23; Jn 1:14). Jesus is the Temple (Jn 2:19-21). Jesus, like Solomon who built the temple, builds a new spiritual Temple, the Church (Mt 16:18; 18:20).

3.) Adoption: Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus is in us and we are in Jesus, "That they may all be one; even as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us ... The glory which you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me" (Jn 17:21-24). Jesus is in us and we are in Jesus. We are the adopted children of God.

4.) Law for Mankind: God's plan to extend His blessings to the whole human race. Jesus does this several times in the Gospels (Lk 7:1-10; Mt 15:21-28; Mk 7:4-30; Jn 4:1-42; Mk 5:1-20). And after His Resurrection, He commands His Apostles to take the message to all the nations (Mt 28:1-20).

In the New Covenant Jesus not only restores our relationship with God that was broken by the sin of Adam and Eve. He makes us part of the family of God, and He opens the way, not to the Garden of Eden where God visited Adam and Eve, but to Heaven where God is always fully present. We join this New Covenant when we are Baptized. Are we LIVING IT?

Rote prayers like the Rosary and litanies are one such style. They are great for praying in groups and to pray individually to lift our minds and hearts to God; or to pray when you are not sure what to pray. Many of them, like the Rosary, can be prayed in different ways. You can focus on the individual prayers or use the memorized prayers and focus instead on the mysteries and qualities you are meditating on. Pilgrimage Walk - Keuterville to the Chapel of St. Gertrude Monastery on Sept 12th. A pilgrimage walk is an ancient spir- itual practice that used walking to a sacred destination as a metaphor and catalyst for an inward journey. Route is 4.1 miles- upon arrival at the Chapel the Reliquary will be opened and the front seating area near the altar will be available for private prayer until 4:45 pm.. Meet in main parking lot at 11am, bring a lunch, lawn chair and drink. Following lunch we will carpool to Keuterville at about 12:30 pm to begin the walk. (To get the most of the experience we recommend walking in silence, the point of the walk is an inward journey). The route will take the average walker 90 minutes. Carpool and shuttle drivers will be available. Open to the public. Participants will be asked to sign a liability waiver.
